12, 19, and 26, 2012 There are extant Bach cantatas for almost every Sunday of the Church Year. In addition, Bach wrote settings of the Passion narrative. Especially well known are the St. John Passion and the St. Matthew Passion. There may be no better way to engage the texts and theology of Holy Week than to hear them through these works of Bach, often called "The Fifth Evangelist." Come hear the music and engage its message, along with a musician who is also a pastor.
